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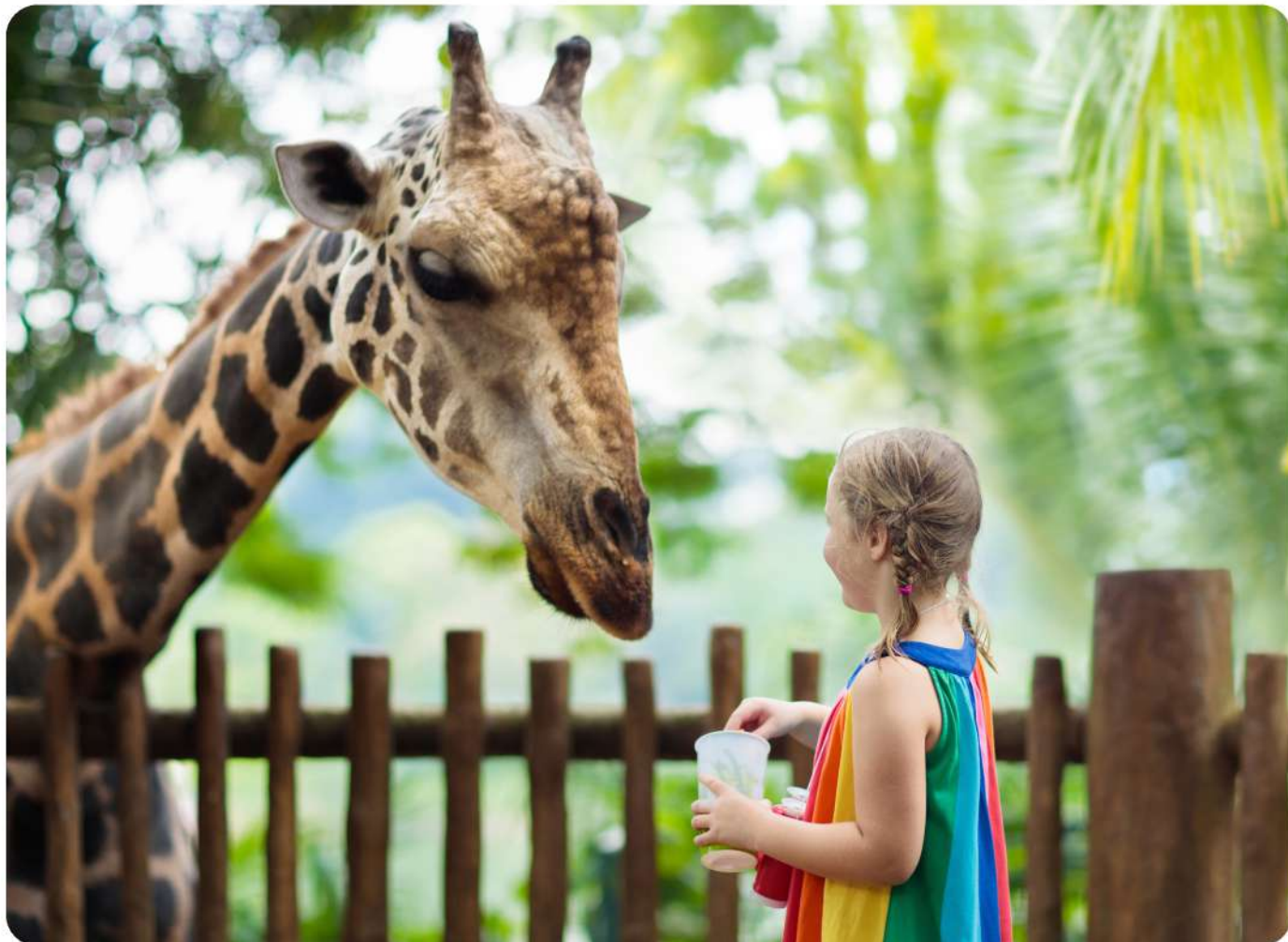

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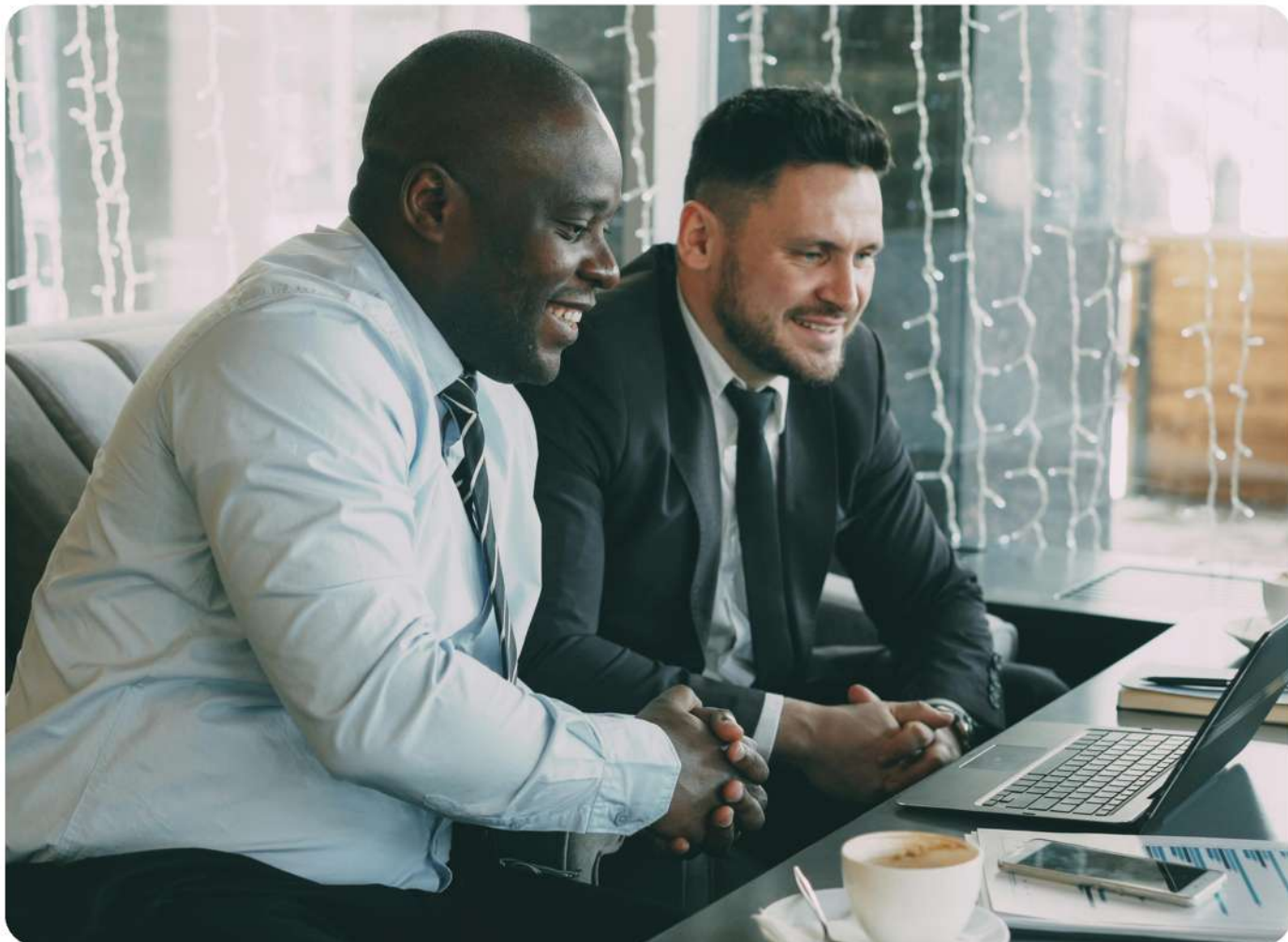

# Picture-Based STORYTELLING / SCENARIO REASONING



# OVERVIEW

## **Picture-based storytelling / scenario reasoning test (similar to Thematic Apperception Test style tasks)**

In these:

- students are shown an image
- they must interpret the situation
- they explain actions, decisions, and outcomes

Examiners are NOT testing “right answers” — they are testing:

- reasoning
- creativity
- language use
- confidence
- decision-making

## **What makes this ADVANCED**

This type of task requires:

- conditional language  
→ “If I go this way, I might...”
- strategic thinking  
→ “First, I would..., then...”
- justification  
→ “...because it is safer/faster.”

## **How you should prepare student (very practical)**

Focus on structured thinking + speaking, not memorization.

# SNOW MOUNTAIN BASE

## Situation:

You are in a snowy mountain area. There is a small enemy base.

## Around you, there are:

- a rope
- binoculars
- a flashlight
- a map

## There are two paths:

- a narrow mountain path (short but dangerous)
- a forest path (long but hidden)



# QUESTIONS

## TEACHER'S GUIDE - DON'T SHOW STUDENT

### Questions:

- What items would you choose and why?
- Which path would you take? Explain your reason.
- How would you use your items step by step?
- What dangers might you face?
- How would you solve the problem if something goes wrong?

### Push further:

- What would you do if the enemy sees you?
- Can you think of a safer plan?



# CITY NIGHT MISSION

## Situation:

You are in a dark city at night. The enemy is hiding in a tall building.

## You have:

- a walkie-talkie
- a disguise
- a flashlight
- a key card

## There are three ways in:

- the front door (guarded)
- the roof (hard to reach)
- the underground parking (dark and quiet)



# QUESTIONS

## TEACHER'S GUIDE - DON'T SHOW STUDENT

### Questions:

- Which way would you enter and why?
- What item is the most important?
- How would you avoid being caught?
- Describe the building and surroundings.
- What is your full plan from start to finish?

### Push further:

- What if your plan fails?
- Can you think of a faster plan?



# ISLAND RESCUE MISSION

## Situation:

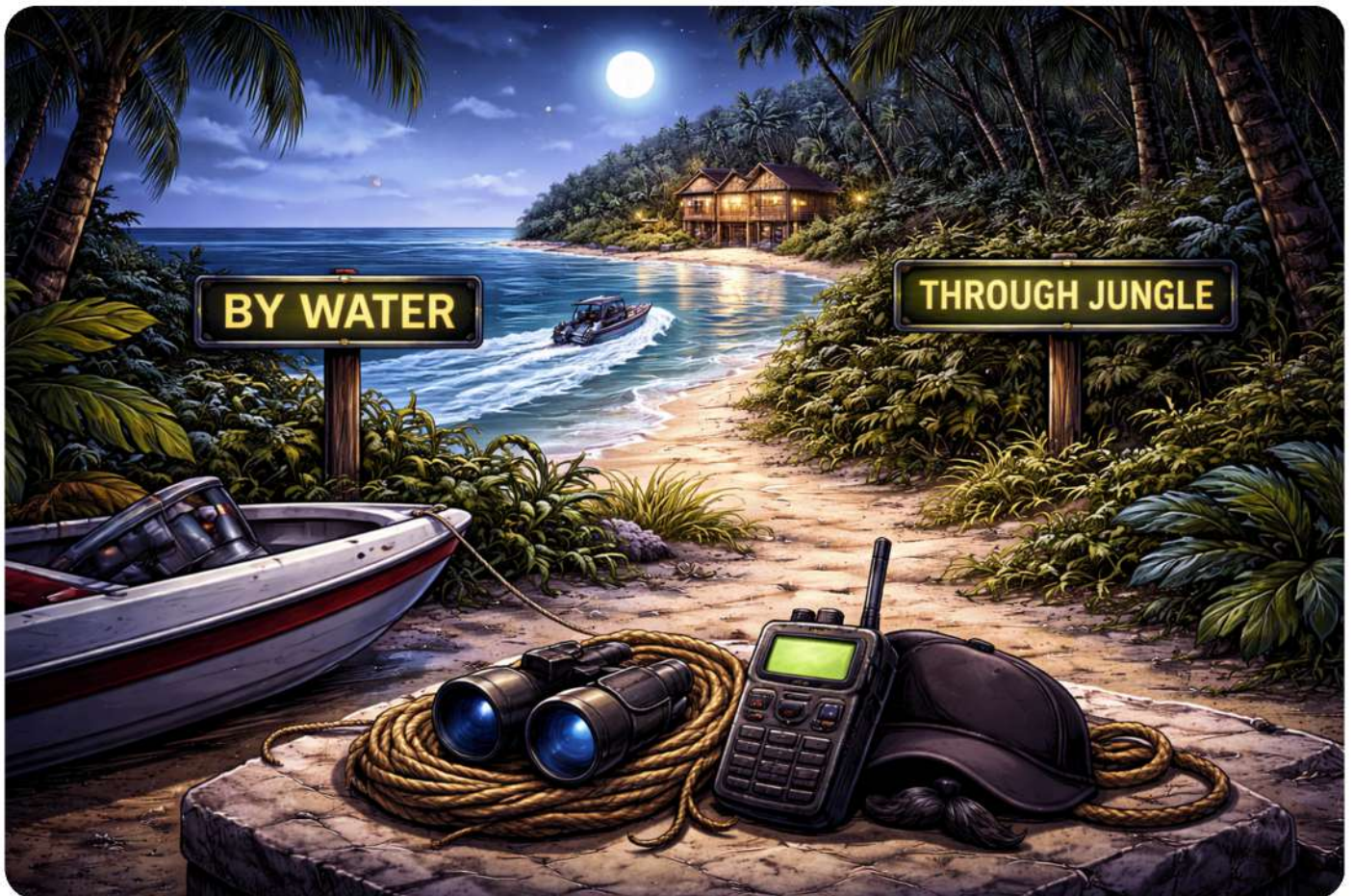
You are on a small island. The enemy is hiding in a wooden house near the beach.

## You have:

- a boat
- a rope
- a pair of binoculars
- a radio
- 

## There are two options:

- go by water (fast but visible)
- go through the jungle (slow but hidden)



# QUESTIONS

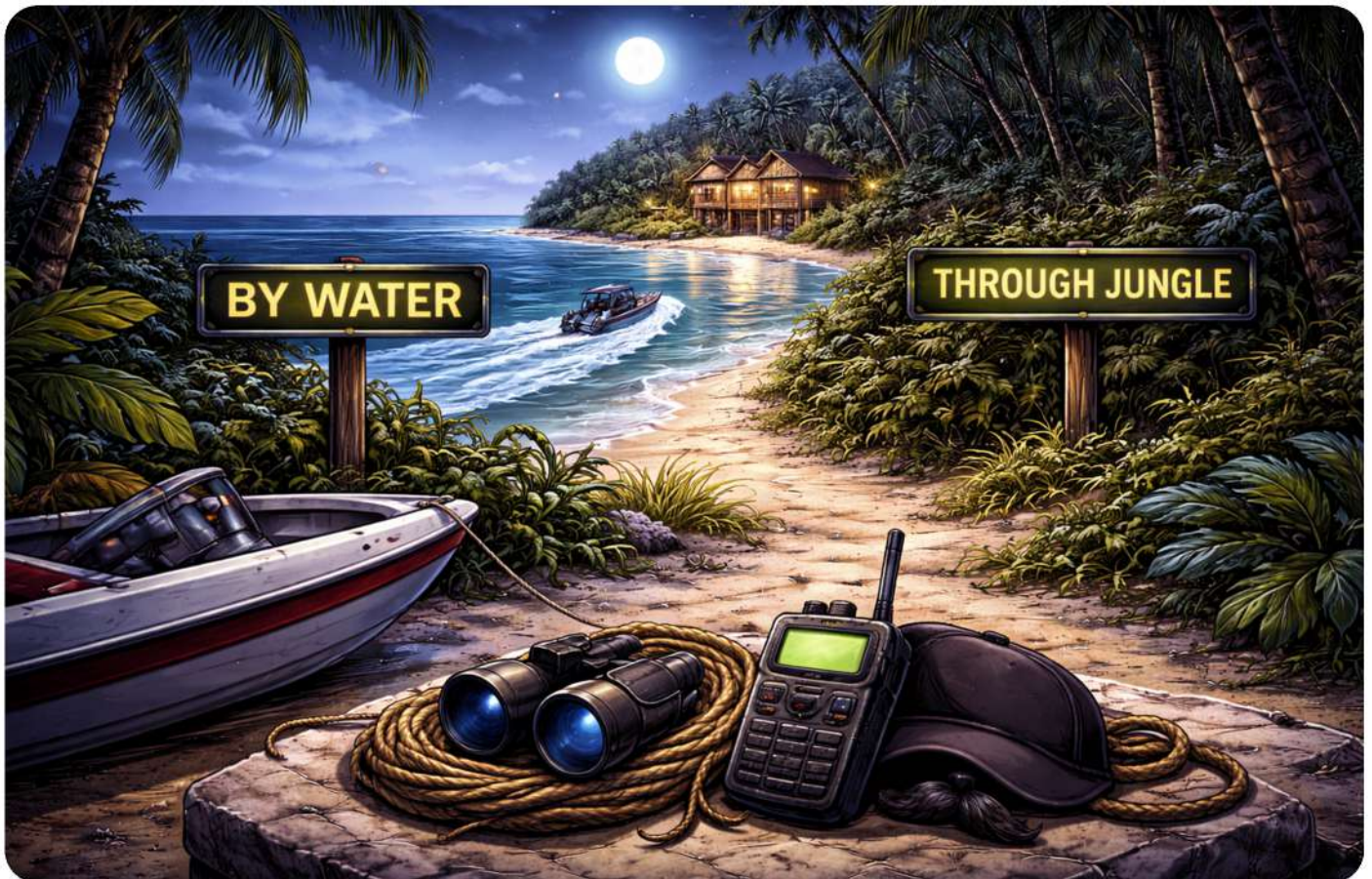
## TEACHER'S GUIDE - DON'T SHOW STUDENT

# MYSTERY LAB

## Situation:

You are inside a secret laboratory. The enemy is somewhere inside, but you don't know where.

## You have:

- a map of the building
- a flashlight
- a key card
- a timer (you only have 10 minutes!)

## There are many rooms:

- control room
- storage room
- main lab
- hidden hallway



# QUESTIONS

### Questions:

- Which room would you check first? Why?
- How will you manage your time?
- What clues would help you find the enemy?
- Describe the lab environment.
- What is your final plan?

### Push further:

- What if the map is wrong?
- How would you change your plan quickly?



# TRAIN STATION ESCAPE MISSION

## Situation:

You are at a busy train station. The enemy is trying to escape on a train.

## You have:

- a backpack
- a phone
- a train ticket
- a jacket

## There are three trains:

- Train A: leaving now (fast but crowded)
- Train B: leaving soon (less crowded)
- Train C: delayed (almost empty)



# QUESTIONS

## Situation:

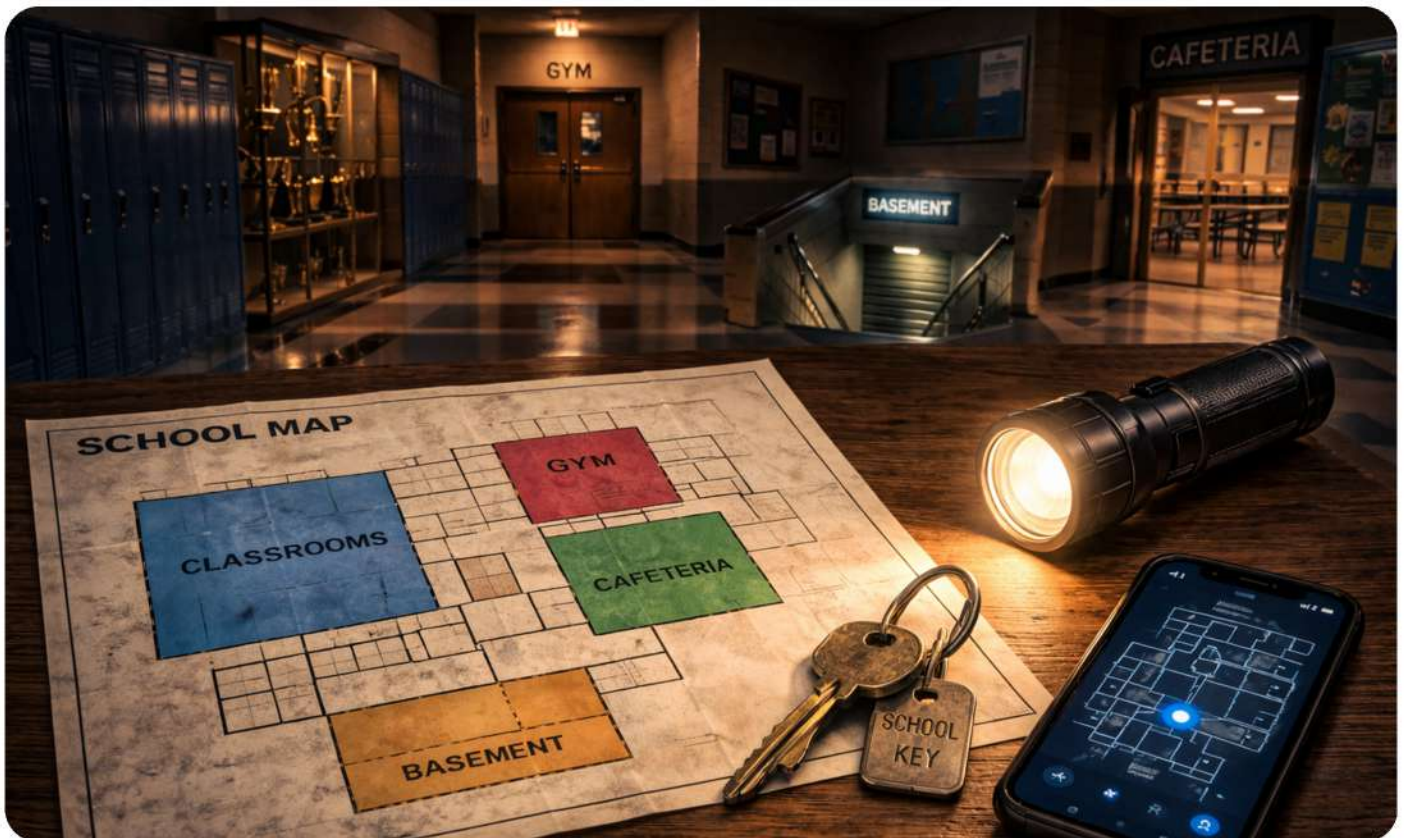
You are in a large school building after hours. The enemy is hiding somewhere inside.
